How to Receive Communion More Worthily:

We prepare to receive Communion on Sunday before we even leave our homes to go to Mass.

Prayerful recollection. The rosary before Mass in an excellent way to prepare. As we arrive in church, we strive to keep reverent silence for those who are praying.

The Eucharistic Fast. We are REQUIRED to keep the Eucharistic fast—no food or drink—for at least one hour before receiving communion. (Water & medicine are, of course, permitted.) This fast shows reverence for what we are to receive and teaches us to hunger for the Body & Blood of Christ.

Appropriate Attire. As Christians, we should dress in a modest manner, wearing clothes that reflect our reverence for God and reflect the dignity of the Mass and each other.

LIVING FAITH REFLECTION

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me. (Mark 10:21)

How wonderful to receive an invitation like this! But the man Jesus invited was rich, and his wealth prevented him from doing what Jesus asked. This gospel story prompts us to ask if there is something that keeps us from following Jesus. Perhaps Jesus asks us to let go of our anger or our fear or our selfishness. These are all things that would keep us from following him with free and loving minds and hearts.

The rich man refused Jesus' invitation and so lost the chance to change his life. Of course, it would have been hard for him to give up his wealth, just as it may be hard for us to give up our attachments. But Jesus tells us in this gospel that what is impossible for us is possible for God.
