**Active Participation.** We use all of ourselves--body, soul and mind--when we attend Mass. We show this through singing the songs, reciting the prayers and responding to the priest.

**The Penitential Rite.** We recognize our sinful-ness and confess the mystery of God's love. Aware of our flaws, we long for the healing presence of Christ.

**Hearing the Word.** We listen attentively to the Scripture readings. Our hearts must burn within us at the hearing of the Word of Truth to receive Jesus more fervently in Holy Communion.

### LIVING FAITH REFLECTION

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

*You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink? (Mark 10:38)*

What an endearingly human picture is painted of James and John here! "Endearing?" you may think as you smirk at their self-centered request. Before judging them too harshly for their desire to have first place in the reign of God, remember that these are two of the disciples Jesus chose to take with him to the Mount of Transfiguration. Even when we are specially chosen by Jesus, we are capable of having grandiose dreams that don't quite fit our vocation.

We are called to serve. We are also called to drink of the cup from which Jesus drinks. It is a cup of darkness, a cup of suffering. In my experience this cup of suffering usually holds a hidden gift, an obscure grace. We may have to hold the cup longer than we wish to discover the gift. Seldom is the gift visible as we drink.
