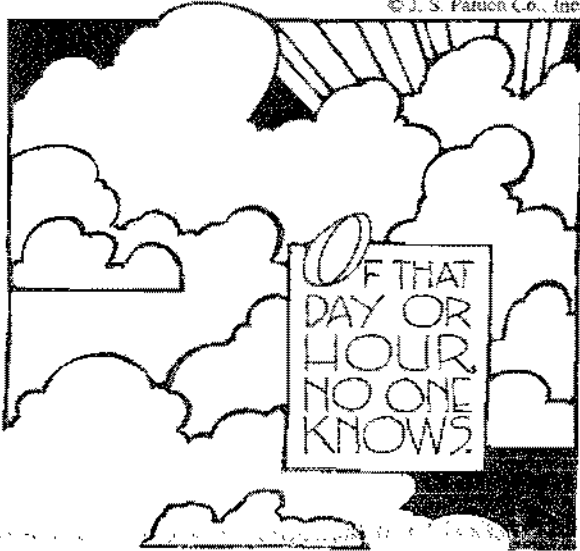

#### NOTICE FROM THE CITY OF TIPTON

On July 22, 2009 an Air Quality Representative from the Kansas Dept. of Health and Environment (KDHE) observed unapproved items in the burn pit (City Dump) that someone had disposed of improperly. The City of Tipton was in noncompliance and prohibited from burning prior to a follow-up inspection. The unapproved items were loaded on a City truck and hauled to the Mitchell Co. Landfill. The City of Tipton had to pay for proper disposal.

Mayor Arnoldy stated at the Sept. meeting of the Tipton City Council that if the practice of dumping prohibited items in the burn pit continues, the entrance will be gated with only specific times open to the public. He realizes this would be an inconvenience.

The KDHE conducts unannounced inspections of the burn pit at frequent intervals. The State of Kansas has the authority to revoke the burn permit if ongoing issues of noncompliance are identified. If the burn pit is closed, individuals will have to haul all grass clippings and trees to the Mitchell Co. Landfill at their own expense. The public is encouraged to dispose of only the approved debris, specifically grass and trees, that is listed on the public information sign. A \$100 fine will be imposed on anyone that disposes of unapproved items in the burn pit.

### **National Catholic Youth Conference:**

We will leave Thursday after the 8:00 am Mass and will be returning home Sunday afternoon.

The kids will receive a blessing at the Mass before they leave for the conference.

I want the kids to earn indulgences while they are at NCYC. They can earn a plenary indulgence by doing the following at NCYC:

--A half-hour's worth of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Or

--Reciting the rosary in a group.

You can earn one indulgence a day. I would like for our CYO to earn four indulgences during our four-day trip.

In addition to these items, they must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father; strive to be free of all sin—even venial sin; receive communion and go to confession. (One confession can cover the four indulgences I hope for them to earn.)
